For Roll No. 1-15: Folk Tale Integration

Retell this chosen folk tale in your own words, ensuring it captures the essence and moral of the original story. You can present this as a dedicated section within your travelogue or create an illustrated version, including drawings or sketches that depict key scenes or characters from the tale.

For Roll No. 16-30: My Story Puppet Show (Finger Puppets)

Bring a simple folk tale from J & K and Gujarati folk tale to life! Choose a very simple Gujarati folk tale or a short story (you can find these online, in children's books, or by asking elders, then translate it into simple English if needed).

- * Rewrite the story in your own words, making it concise and easy to understand.
- * Create finger puppets or stick puppets for the main characters of your chosen story. Be creative using materials like paper, old socks, felt, or other craft supplies.
- * Practice narrating your rewritten story using your puppets, imagining you are putting on a small show for your family. Focus on clear narration and making the puppets interact with the story.

For Roll No. 31 onwards: A Comic to a Penfriend

Imagine you have a new penfriend who lives in Gujarat, and you want to tell them about your life or share a fun experience with them, but in a creative way! Create a short comic strip (at least 6-8 panels) that depicts a conversation or an interaction between two main characters: yourself and your Gujarati penfriend. Design your own characters for both yourself and your penfriend. The dialogue and visual

elements of the comic should convey a friendly exchange, perhaps sharing cultural insights, describing a daily routine, or discussing a hobby. Ensure your comic has clear speech bubbles and expressive illustrations for the characters and their actions.

INTEGRATED PROJECT

Theme: "J&K & Gujarat: Deep Down and Democratically Alive!" Introduction

India is a land of breathtaking diversity – from the snowy peaks of Jammu & Kashmir to the vibrant coasts of Gujarat. But have you ever wondered what lies beneath the ground we walk on or behind the leaders we vote for? This holiday homework invites you to become a young explorer and journalist from the year 2050, embarking on a journey through both the natural layers of the Earth and the institutional layers of democracy.

Through this project, you will dig deep—literally and politically! You'll explore how the interior of the Earth shapes our landscapes and how democratic institutions shape our societies. By travelling (through imagination and research) from the mountains of Jammu & Kashmir to the salt plains of Gujarat, you'll witness how geography and governance come together to build India's rich identity.

So grab your notebook, wear your explorer's cap, and get ready to document your discoveries in the form of a Travel Journal and News Report Booklet—where science meets civics in the most exciting way!

Part A: Travel Journal – Geologist's Diary (Interior of the Earth) HINT POINTS:

- Create a travel diary entry where you visit the mountains of J&K and the plains/coasts of Gujarat.
- Describe what you discover beneath the land the layers of the Earth (crust, mantle, core) and how these might have created earthquakes, volcanoes, or landforms in each state.
- Use 3D models, flaps, or cutouts to show layers of the Earth and physical features.

 Add an "Earthquake Alert News" page showing recent tremors in both states and their causes (research-based).

Part B: News Report – Democracy from Ground Zero (Institutional Representation of Democracy)

HINT POINTS:

- Write a mock news report or TV script as a journalist visiting a village in J&K and a town in Gujarat.
- Report how local democratic institutions (like panchayats, municipalities, or state assemblies) work and how people participate in democracy.
- Create a comparison chart of democratic institutions in both states.
- Add a creative segment: "Democracy Talks" write a fictional or real interview with a student, teacher, or local leader about how democracy touches their daily life.

Part C: Topic: "Plastic Packaging - Friend or Foe?"

Question:

Design a Poster to explore the role of plastic in food packaging. Your task is to become a young food safety scientist investigating how plastic packaging helps keep food fresh and safe, and at the same time, whether it harms our planet.

Your Poster should include the following:

Creative Title: Example – "The Secret Life of Food Wrappers" or "Sealed Fresh!" **Science Behind Freshness**: How does plastic keep food fresh? Role of airtight sealing, hygiene, and moisture control.

Types of Packaging Plastic: Which plastics are food-safe? Real-life examples: Milk pouches, chip packets, fruit trays, etc.


Flip Side – The Plastic Problem: What happens when plastic is thrown away? Pollution and its impact on soil, animals, and oceans.

Green Solutions: What are eco-friendly alternatives? Biodegradable wraps, cloth bags, etc.

Fun Zone: Add a quiz or fun fact corner. Example: "Would your lunch stay fresh without plastic?"

Theme: "India in Numbers – Gujarat & Jammu & Kashmir"

1. Integers: "Temperature Tales from North to West

Activity:

Compare winter and summer temperatures of 5 cities in Gujarat and 5 in Jammu & Kashmir.

Instructions:

Find approximate temperature data (e.g., Ahmedabad: 45°C in summer, 10°C in winter; Gulmarg: 25°C in summer, -5°C in winter).

Plot the temperatures on a vertical number line showing both positive and negative integers.

Answer the following questions:

- 1. Which region has the lowest winter temperature?
- 2. What is the temperature difference between the coldest and hottest city?
- 3. Fractions: "Recipe Ratios from the Kitchens of India"

Activity:

Explore 2 dishes from each region (e.g Dhokla from Gujarat; Rogan Josh and Kashmiri Kahwa from Jammu & Kashmir).

Instructions:

- 1. Write down ingredients in fractions (½ tsp, ¾ cup, etc.).
- 2. Double or triple the recipe using multiplication of fractions.

Write word problems such as:

If one recipe serves 4, how much of each ingredient is needed for 12 people?

Activity Name: "Shopping at Navratri Fair"


Create a Navratri shopping list with at least 6 items (chaniya choli, bangles, dandiya sticks, snacks, etc.) with prices in decimals.
